# Big Idea

- Prompt:
  - Think through the following three lists and find which time, season, or element you most identify with.
- Project:
  - With this theme in mind, you will create a lantern using slab-building techniques and texture decoration.

## Requirements

### What are you learning?

- Students will learn how to construct a form using slab-building techniques. Students will also continue to build skills in subtractive techniques and the intentional use of texture.

### Why are you learning it?

- Slab-building is an important form of hand-building for other projects and ceramics work. Texture is a major component of design with ceramics work as well.

### How will I know you learned it?

- Grading rubric (back of packet)

1. Lantern must be a creative response to the selected theme
2. Slab-building technique
3. Should be at least 5 inches on the longest side
4. Use of both hand drawn and stamped texture as decoration:
  - a. Subtractive decoration
  - b. Creating and using own stamp
5. Lid (with flange)
6. Sculptural element (ex. creative handle on lid)
7. Each side must have at least 30% cut outs
8. Workbook must be completed by the end of project (date:\_\_\_\_)
9. Bonus: Feet on the bottom of the structure

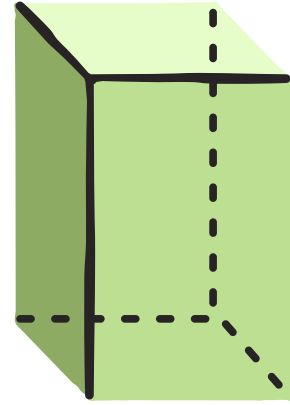
